The discussion then shifts to practical applications of AI in language learning, specifically looking at task design and how it could be optimized to align with AI's evolving capabilities. Specific, in-depth examples of possible work that can be done outside and inside the classroom will be presented, along with useful prompts to teach students and strategies for ensuring student accountability when engaging in AI-assisted tasks. By examining AI-integrated lesson design, this session provides educators with practical approaches to fostering student engagement, critical thinking, and creative problemsolving in technology-enhanced classrooms.
